

ESF-12 Situation Report

August 19, 2004 1500

- In Florida approximately 85 percent of the customers have had power restored. Currently, 322,775 remain without power. Utilities report that restoration in hard hit counties could take the remainder of the month. Note some counties may show slight increases from the previous report as more data are available from municipals and cooperatives.
- Counties with significant remaining outages are listed below.
 - We have two OEA personnel staffing the ESF-12 desk at the Orlando Disaster Field Office (DFO).
 - Office of Energy Assurance continues to staff the ESF-12 desk at the Atlanta Regional Operations Center (ROC).

Municipalities	<p>Over 150,000 customers have had power restored. 62,000 outages remain (as of 8/19 AM)</p> <p>The majority of outages remain in Orange and Osceola Counties.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In Orange County, Orlando Utility Commission reports that power has been restored to 120,000 customers. 29,000 customers remain without power, down from a peak of 149,000. • In Osceola County power has been restored to 33,000 customers. 25,000 remain without power, down from a peak of the 58,000.
Cooperatives	36,600 outages remain from a peak of over 200,000 (as of 8/19 AM).
