## U.S. Electric Companies Use Record Natural Gas to Generate Power in January

U.S. electric companies in the lower 48 states used record amounts of natural gas to generate power in January 2015 as low prices made it more economical to burn gas instead of coal. Power generators used an average 23.1 Bcf/d of gas in January 2015, up 13 percent from the 20.5 Bcf/d average in January 2014, according to Thomson Reuters Analytics. That was the most gas consumed by the power sector during the month of January on record, according to federal data going back to 1973.

## Striking USW Members Bring Oil Industry Safety Campaign to Europe

A delegation of striking refinery workers from the United Steelworkers (USW) will bring their campaign for a safer oil industry to Europe, meeting with allies from labor unions in the Netherlands and Great Britain, according to USW officials. USW members will meet with leaders from the FNV oil workers union at Shell and LyondellBasell in the Netherlands today through Wednesday and then travel to London on Thursday to meet with leaders from Unite the Union, the largest industrial union in Great Britain and Ireland. More than 5,000 USW members are on strike at 11 refineries owned by Shell, Marathon, Tesoro, BP, and LyondellBasell, with the USW citing concerns about safety, onerous overtime, and unsafe staffing levels.

### Texas Oil Rig Count Falls by More than 200 in Past Two Weeks – Baker Hughes

More than 200 drilling rigs were taken out of service in Texas in the past two weeks as crude oil prices remained between \$45 and \$50 per barrel, according to Baker Hughes. One year ago, Texas had 845 rigs going compared to 654 operating now. Nationwide, more than 400 drilling rigs were taken out of service in two weeks, with 280 of those being oil rigs. There were 417 rigs operating in the Permian Basin last week, 103 fewer than just two weeks ago. The Eagle Ford Shale saw declines, too, declining by 58 rigs in two weeks.

# Williams and DCP Midstream Announce First Gas from 400 MMcf/d Keathley Canyon Connector in Ultra-Deepwater Gulf of Mexico

Williams Partners on Monday announced with DCP Midstream Partners, LP that the new extended Discovery natural gas gathering pipeline system is now flowing natural gas. The Keathley Canyon ConnectorTM deepwater gas gathering pipeline system and the South Timbalier Block 283 junction platform are serving producers in the central ultra-deepwater Gulf of Mexico. The 20-inch, 209 mile Keathley Canyon Connector, which is capable of gathering more than 400 MMcf/d of natural gas, originates in the southeast portion of the Keathley Canyon protraction area and terminates into Discovery's 30-inch diameter mainline at Discovery's new junction platform. The pipeline was constructed in depths of up to 7,200 feet of water approximately 300 miles south-southwest of New Orleans. The Keathley Canyon Connector extension is supported by long-term agreements with the Lucius and Hadrian South owners, as well as the Heidelberg and Hadrian North owners, for natural gas gathering, transportation and processing services for production from those fields. In addition, the new pipeline system is in proximity to other high-potential deepwater Gulf of Mexico discoveries and prospects.

# Update: Libya Reopens Hariga Oil Port, Ending Strike

Libya reopened its oil port of Hariga on Tuesday, ending a strike by guards that threatened to further cut petroleum production that is already battered by factional fighting over two export terminals. Libya shut most operations at the Hariga terminal near Egypt's border – the last functioning land oil export terminal on Saturday after security guards prevented a tanker from docking in a protest over wage payments. Libya's two largest oil ports, Es Sider and Ras Lanuf – with a combined capacity of around 600,000 b/d – have been closed by fighting between the two loose confederations of armed factions since December.
