Update: Fires Approach Power Lines in California, but CAISO Spokesman Says no Significant Threat to Power Grid October 14

A fire was "a couple of miles" from a 500-kV, Arizona-San Diego, California power line, and another blaze was close to a 230-kV line feeding power to the San Onofre nuclear power plant, a spokesman with the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) said. The spokesman said that there was no "imminent or imminent" hazard to the grid, and that reserve output was available. Bloomberg News, 14:11 October 14, 2008

Update: Citing Customer Requests, SDG&E Postpones Power-Cutting Fire Plan

Although the National Weather Service has a Red Flag Warning in effect until 10:00 PM tonight PST, San Diego Gas & Electric (SDG&E) postponed a plan that would have allowed it to cut power to certain residents, in certain cases, to prevent fires from spreading. The policy took effect last week, but ongoing fires could have forced SDG&E to implement the plan almost immediately. Customer complaints, however, led the company to postpone the plan.

Update: Estimated 45,397 b/d of Oil Production Remains Shut in Louisiana October 14 after Hurricanes Ike and Gustav

Operators have restored 98,834 b/d of oil output among 17 Louisiana parishes and in-State offshore areas, the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources reported October 14. The restored figure accounted for 61.5 percent of the region's estimated 155,767 b/d capacity (the numbers are in addition to MMS reports of Federal offshore production). An estimated 45,397 b/d, or 29.2 percent of capacity, remained shut. The status of the remaining 14,536 b/d, or 9.3 percent, was unconfirmed.

Hovensa Shutting Processing Units at 500,000 b/d Hovensa Refinery on St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands as Hurricane Omar Approaches October 15

Hovensa is stalling "essentially all its processing and auxiliary equipments" at St. Croix as Hurricane Omar approaches, a company spokesman said. The company is leaving equipment on that is "necessary to maintain supply of power to the complex," the spokesman said. Omar, which strengthened from a tropical storm to a hurricane yesterday, could grow to a Category 2 hurricane when it reaches the northern U.S. Virgin Islands. The storm is expected to traverse near or over St. Croix this evening. The U.S. Coast Guard shut St. Croix's harbor yesterday, and that harbor was still shut, as of latest reports. The St. Croix refinery delivered 338,000 b/d of refined products to the U.S. mainland in July 2008. Hovensa is a joint-venture of Hess and Venezuela's state-owned company, PdVSA.

Tropical Storm Omar Cuts Power to 200,000 b/d Puerto La Cruz, Venezuela Refinery Refinery Restarts as Storm Strengthens to Hurricane by October 15

PdVSA confirmed that Omar knocked out power to some units at the 200,000 b/d Puerto La Cruz facility, and caused officials to suspend tanker activity at the refinery October 14. The facility had resumed normal operations by today, October 15 a refinery official said. Elsewhere, refinery sources said the storm had halted tanker loadings at the 900,000 b/d Amuay-Cardon refining complex. The 135,000 b/d El Palito refinery was not affected, another source said. Valero Reports Power Cable Failure to 55,000 b/d FCC at 171,000 b/d McKee, Texas Refinery October 14

According to a filing with state regulators, the refinery sustained a power cable failure to the gasoline-producing fluid catalytic cracker (FCC) electrostatic precipitator. A company spokesman confirmed the FCC was running "temporarily at slightly reduced rates." He added: "We don't expect a lengthy outage." Workers will replace the faulty cable, the filing said.

Update: Oil Shipments to Reach 55 Percent Capacity along BP's 1 Million b/d BTC Pipeline from Azerbaijan

The 1 million b/d Baku-Tbilisi-Ceyhan (BTC) pipeline will deliver an average 548,571 b/d, and a total 19.2 million barrels, from October 18 to November 21, according to revised loading schedules. The totals mark a sharp rise from previously-planned loadings of 380,857 b/d, or a total 13.3 million barrels. BP restarted a large platform at its massive Azeri-Chirag-Gunashli field complex on October 9. Output at the 900,000 b/d complex had been cut to 300,000 b/d in September due to a gas leak.

Update: Estimated 526 MMcf/d of Natural Gas Production Remains Shut in Louisiana October 14 after Hurricanes Ike and Gustav

Operators have restored 942 MMcf/d of natural gas output among 17 Louisiana parishes and in-State offshore areas, the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources reported October 14. The restored figure accounted for 57.4 percent of the region's estimated 1,642 MMcf/d capacity (the numbers are in addition to MMS reports of Federal offshore production). An estimated 526 MMcf/d, or 32.0 percent of capacity, remained shut. The status of the remaining 173 MMcf/d, or 10.6 percent, was unconfirmed.

Bomb Explodes Along Encana's 12-inch Sour Gas Pipeline in British Columbia, Canada Over Weekend

A bomb exploded and damaged—but did not rupture—Encana's 12-inch sour gas pipeline in British Columbia. The line delivers sour gas to the Steep Rock gas plant, but the incident did trigger any leaks. The explosion likely occurred overnight October 11-12, creating a six-foot crater in the ground. Media outlets received a letter October 10 instructing oil and gas companies to leave the town, and a hunter discovered the bombed site on October 12. Officials are investigating the incident.
