Hurricane Dennis Situation Report #6
July 13, 2005 (10:00 AM EDT)

HIGHLIGHTS

Less than 128 thousand customers are reported without power in Florida as of 7:00AM 7/13/05 representing 1.4% of Florida electricity customers as reported by the Florida EOC.

Gulf Power has brought in about 3,400 outside crews to help in restoration of service. Most of the 500 miles of damaged transmission lines repaired and all but three of the 47 damaged substations back up, infrastructure repairs that must be completed before neighborhood lines can be re-energized. Weather permitting, Gulf Power expects to have power restored to 95 percent of the 242,000 customers affected by Dennis by early next week, excluding Santa Rosa Island. Walton County should be fully restored 7/13.

Alabama Power reports on its website that 13,307 customers are without power but that almost all will be restored 7/13. As of yesterday afternoon some 6,800 cooperative customers were without power.

OE had deployed staff at FEMA headquarters and at operations centers in Atlanta, GA and Orlando, FL, and the State EOCs in Mississippi and Alabama to cover ESF #12 requirements. ESF #12 is being demobilized and possible preparations for currently tropical storm Emily will start shortly. This will be the last Situation Report for Hurricane Dennis.
